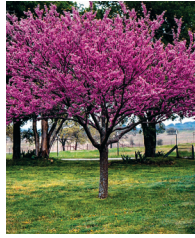

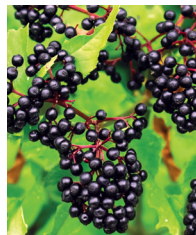

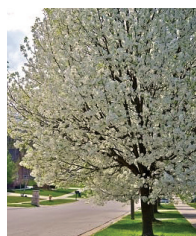

<b>Conifers</b>		
<b>Species</b>	<b>Full Grown Characteristics</b>	<b>Price</b>
<b>Eastern Hemlock</b> <i>Tsuga canadensis</i>	Evergreen with dense foliage and a pyramidal shape. It reaches 70 feet and has flat needles and small cylindrical cones. While mainly used today for ornamental purposes, its leaves have been used to produce a tea that contains a high level of vitamin C	<b>\$13.00 Per Bundle of 10 Trees</b>
<b>White Cedar</b> <i>Thuja occidentalis</i>	Evergreen with dense branches and a narrow cone shape on top with a broad pyramid shape towards the bottom. It reaches 60 feet and has scale-like and abruptly pointed leaves. While human use is not recommended, the White cedar provides excellent habitat for native wildlife to the Southern Pennsylvania region	<b>\$13.00 Per Bundle of 10 Trees</b>
<b>White Pine</b> <i>Pinus strobus</i>	Evergreen conifer with blue-green needles, reaches 100 feet tall. It produces slender cones, and is an excellent food source and habitat for birds and other native wildlife	<b>\$13.00 Per Bundle of 10 Trees</b>

<b>Species</b>	<b>Full Grown Characteristics</b>	<b>Price</b>
<b>Arrowwood</b> <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Coming from the Honeysuckle Family, the Arrowwood is a deciduous shrub that can grow up to 10 feet tall and 8 feet wide with shiny dark green leaves. The Arrowwood produces small white flower clusters and blueish/ black berries which are edible and can be turned into jams and pies	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>Northern Bayberry</b> <i>Myrica pensylvanica</i>	A Dense deciduous shrub that is known for its strongly aromatic nature. Can reach up to 15 feet tall and 10 feet wide, Females can produce a small and waxy grayish berry that cannot be eaten but be used to make candles, soaps, and sealing wax.	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>Redbud</b> <i>Cercis canadensis</i>	A Vase-Shaped, Perennial, Multi Trunked tree or shrub that is covered with Pink or white blooms in the wintertime. Can get up to 30 feet tall	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>White Flowering Dogwood</b> <i>Cornus florida</i>	A small bush-like tree that can grow up to 40 ft tall produces a white leaf about 3-6 inches long Starting in May or June. While human use is only ornamental, fruit and leaves are a major food source for much of the wildlife in South Central PA	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>

<b>Hardwoods</b>		
<b>Species</b>	<b>Full Grown Characteristics</b>	<b>Price</b>
<b>Black Cherry</b> <i>Prunus serotina</i>	A fast-growing tree that can reach 50-80 feet tall. Will produce a tube structure of white short lobed petals and a small black berry that can be eaten raw or used on in jellies or jams	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>Red Maple</b> <i>Acer rubrum</i>	A deciduous tree that can grow up to 65 ft tall. Produces 6-10 cm long and wide leaves that have 3 shallow, short, pointed lobes, which turn red in the Autum. Although it is not preferred to other maple trees, the sap from the red maple can be used to make syrup.	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>Shagbark Hickory</b> <i>Carya ovata</i>	A large deciduous tree that can grow between 70-90 feet tall with a 50-70 ft spread. In older trees the bark develops a shaggy/ flaky appearance and is used by shelter for many Moths and butterflies.	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>Sweet Birch</b> <i>Betula lenta</i>	A deciduous tree that typically grows to be 40-50 ft tall. It is commonly found in yards due to the red-brown bark and yellow foliage that it produces. Although the main human use is in lumber the sweet birch is known to attract butterflies and caterpillars	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>
<b>White Oak</b> <i>Quercus alba</i>	A large tree that grows up to 100 ft tall with a round to wide spreading crown. The bright green leaves are 5-6 inches long and have a rounded tip with a wedged shaped base and evenly notched edges. While a great shade tree for humans, the Acron is used as food for a variety of animals in south central PA	<b>\$2.50 Per Tree</b>

The apple is crunchy and juicy with a very sweet taste.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">R – EMLA 111 BT – Mid to late season RT – mid-September</p> <p>O - M-111 Apple Rootstock is one of the most vigorous and well-adapted apple rootstocks, M-111 is a semi-standard tree reaching 80% of standard tree's height, or 15-25 ft. tall but can easily be kept at a manageable height with summer pruning. Tolerates, wet, dry, or poor soils and induces bearing at a young age. Well anchored and deep rooted.</p>	<b>\$22.00 Per Tree</b>
<b>RubyRush Apple</b>	<p>A disease resistant apple that has an appealing red color with aromatic, juicy, and crisp taste that is sweet with a little tart edge to it.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">R – EMLA 111 BT – Mid Season RT – Late September</p> <p>O - M-111 Apple Rootstock is one of the most vigorous and well-adapted apple rootstocks, M-111 is a semi-standard tree reaching 80% of standard tree's height, or 15-25 ft. tall but can easily be kept at a manageable height with summer pruning. <b>Allegheny Serviceberry</b> <i>Amelanchier laevis</i>	Getting up to 25 feet high and wide Allegheny serviceberry is an understory tree with four-season interest. The early white spring flowers, outstanding orange-red fall color, and striking gray bark make it a lovely specimen for any landscape. The edible purplish-black fruit in late summer is attractive to many birds.	<b>\$7.00 Per Tree</b>
<b>Witch-hazel</b> <i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>	Growing anywhere between 10-25 feet, witch-hazel is a large shrub with a picturesque irregular branching habit that naturally grows along woodland edges. The large, rounded, dark green leaves often hang onto the winter branches. The yellow strap-like flowers of this native shrub are among the last blooms to appear in fall but are often hidden by the leaves. The fruit capsules mature a year after flowering, splitting open to expel seeds that are attractive to birds.	<b>\$7.00 Per Tree</b>
<b>Tulip Poplar</b> <i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>	Growing anywhere from 40-90 feet the Tulip Poplar is one of the largest native trees in North America. It is a member of the magnolia family and has distinct tulip shaped flowers. The showy, goblet shaped, orange-yellow-green flowers appear in late spring after the leaves form. The cone-like seed clusters sit upright on the branches. The golden-yellow fall color of the Tulip Poplar makes this an excellent choice for large landscapes.	<b>\$7.00 Per Tree</b>
<b>Chestnut Oak</b> <i>Quercus montana</i>	The chestnut oak is a medium-sized tree that typically grows 50 to 80 feet tall and up to two feet in diameter. <b>Creeping Phlox</b> "Emerald Blue"/ "Purple Beauty"	The Creeping Phlox is a drought tolerant perennial that spreads out from its original planting. Blooming in April or may this plant will produce a beautiful half inch flower that attracts butterflies and many other pollinators	<b>\$6.00 Per Plant</b>

<p><b>Gloriosa Daisy "Goldsturm"</b></p>	<p>Goldsturm Gloriosa Daisy has masses of beautiful gold daisy flowers with dark brown eyes at the ends of the stems from mid-summer to early fall, which are most effective when planted in groupings. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its serrated pointy leaves remain dark green in color throughout the season.</p>	<p><b>\$6.00 Per Plant</b></p>
<p><b>Centaurea "Amethyst in Snow"</b></p>	<p>The Amethyst in snow is a perennial that makes a great bed or border edger plant. The flowers feature well-spaced, tubular, pure white petals radiating from contrasting deep blue-purple centers. Flowers bloom in May-June atop stems typically rising 12-18" tall over a clump of silvery-green, lance-shaped leaves.</p>	<p><b>\$6.00 Per Plant</b></p>
<p><b>Armeria "Dream Cloud"</b></p>	<p>The Dream Cloud boasts masses of large dreamy white, globe-shaped blooms neatly held atop sturdy upright stems. Ideal for front of border where you want a low edge of white flowers, with attractive green foliage clumps when not in flower. <p><b>Penstemon "Red Riding Hood"</b></p>	<p>The 'Red Riding Hood' is well known for its vibrant red tubular flowers and an upright, clumping habit. This plant is known as a garden jewel, and boast a profusion of blooms that create a visually striking display</p>	<p><b>\$6.00 Per Plant</b></p>
<p><b>Monarda "Panorama Mix"</b></p>	<p>Semidouble blooms in shades of lavender, salmon, magenta, and pale to bright pinks are useful as cut and edible flowers. Additionally, monarda attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds to the garden.</p>	<p><b>\$6.00 Per Plant</b></p>
<p><b>Carex "Red Rooster"</b></p>	<p>'Red Rooster' is an upright, clumping selection of leatherleaf sedge that features coppery-red, finely textured foliage. <p><b>Jersey Knight Asparagus</b></p>	<p>Jersey Knight Asparagus is a perennial vegetable that produces edible shoots or spears which may be harvested in April-May and will become dormant in the winter months. This rooted bundle comes with 10 crowns, ready to be planted which should be able to be harvested next season.
